Call for Submission

Qualifications of an applicant:

- Students from Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Timor-Leste, or Vietnam.
- Engaged in the research area of analytical sciences to support food safety, environmental & health protection.

Applicants are required to

- Submit an abstract not more than 300 words including the problem statement, methodology, results & discussion, conclusion, and impact of research.
- Submit supporting documents, eg: publication (if applicable)

Applicants must demonstrate the innovative nature and the value of the research in advancing food safety, environmental and health protection.
